Next stop was Costa Rica. For this part of our trip we were accompanied by our Costa Rican coordinator Douglas Rossman and joined by our close friend Jerri Betts, a fellow CBC graduate. We hit the ground running as we all arrived in San Jose, Costa Rica on Tuesday night September 16th and were on the road to Puerto Limon on Wednesday morning in order to start ministering in church services that evening. Our schedule and time in Limon was very much orchestrated by the Holy Spirit. We held our scheduled church services and seminars which were a blessing. Then the Holy Spirit added other “one on one” meetings with pastors that were life changing for them. One pastor we met with told us that he had been asking God many questions and he himself was very discouraged with the ministry. He told God that morning, “God I need answers and I need them soon, because I can’t and do not want to continue like this.” A mutual friend spontaneously asked us to go with him to visit this pastor that we had never met before. When we left two hours later he said, “now I know what I need to do and which way to go, I have my answers”. It was interesting as we reflected back on the

meeting with this pastor. Each one of us shared as the Holy Spirit directed us, and each one of us kept answering the questions that the pastor had in his heart. God is GOOD!

After we finished our time in Puerto Limon on Sunday afternoon we traveled to San Jose, where we repacked our suitcases and left on the 11pm bus for Chinandega, Nicaragua. We arrived on Monday at 1:30pm and began the series of meetings that we had scheduled that night. Our ministry in Chinandega consisted of church services, Bible study meetings, teaching in a pastors meeting and individual ministry to various persons that God sent across our path.

On Thursday we were up early to take a bus to Managua-our last stop in Nicaragua. Here we spent some time with a couple that we became friends with while mutually attending CBC Colorado named Carolina and Oswaldo Santos. We had not seen them in a number of years but time and distance have had no effect on our relationship as we took up where we seemingly left off in Colorado Springs.

We were able to meet some new pastors and minister to them and in their churches. The message of God’s love, God’s grace and who we are in Christ seems to be the cool drink of water in a dry and thirsty land that people are yearning for everywhere.
