

## To Know Him!

Jesus asked his disciples the question, Whom do men say that I the Son of man am? Their reply was, "Some think you are John the Baptist, some say Elijah, some Jeremiah or one of the other prophets." But Jesus said, What I really want to know is who do you say I am? Simon Peter answered by saying, You're the Christ, the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Jesus responded by saying, Bless you, Simon, son of Jonah! You didn't get that answer out of books or from teachers. My Father in heaven, God himself had to reveal it to you. Matthew 16:13-17 Msg. Hosea 4:6 tells us, that God's people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. The enemy wants to kill, steal and destroy the knowledge we have of God because living the abundant life that God promises to bless us with depends on what we know about Him. I believe we need to acknowledge and receive for ourselves the prayer Paul prayed for the church in Ephesus: For this cause I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named, That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love, May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; And to know the love of Christ,

<u>Christ</u>, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be <u>filled with all the fulness of God</u>. Now unto him that is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, <u>according to the power that worketh in us</u>, Unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end.
