The Fear of the Lord

There are many passages in the Bible that speak of the blessings that come with fearing God.

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.

The angel of the Lord abides with those that fear him.

Those that fear God will lack no good thing.

Great is the mercy of the Lord toward them that fear him.

God pours out his compassion on those that fear him.

It shall be well with them that fear him.

For years people have typically entertained the same attitude that the Pharisees had: God brought you into this world and he can take you out if you don't measure up to his expectations.

Wherefore the Lord said, Forasmuch as this people draw near *me* with their mouth, and with their lips do honor me, but have removed their heart far from me, and *their fear toward me is taught by the precept of men*: Isaiah29:13

In Psalms 34:11 God says, let me teach you the fear of the Lord.

He has not given us a spirit of fear but of power, love and a sound mind.

Romans 8:15 says that we have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear.

The promised blessings that come with fearing God are not based on measuring up to a set of man-made conditions that are impossible to meet.

God continues to say in this same passage.... but I have given you the spirit of adoption whereby you cry Abba Father. If you put all of this into simple terms, God is really saying I brought you into this world and I will take good care of you in the midst of it, if you trust me to care for you like a father.

I will bless the LORD at all times: his praise *shall* continually *be* in my mouth. My soul shall make her boast in the LORD: the humble shall hear *thereof*, and be glad. O magnify the LORD with me, and let us exalt his name together. I sought the LORD, and he heard me, and delivered me from all my fears. Psalms 34:1-4

O taste and see that the LORD is good: blessed is the man that trusts in him. Psalms 34:8

Don't view your situations and talk as if He won't be there to intervene on your behalf. Seek His peace. Don't settle for anything less. Psalms 34:13-14

The LORD redeems the soul of his servants: and none of them that trust in him shall be desolate. Psalms 34:22

According to the Hebrew dictionary the word desolate means to be guilty of something deserving punishment; to be offensive. In other words God is saying if you turn to me in the midst of your adverse situations and put your trust in me, I will show you much mercy, and be there for you because nothing thrills me more than for you to boldly come into my presence and say 'Abba Father!'

Psalms 34:11-15 Come, ye children, hearken unto me: I will teach you the fear of the LORD. 12 What man is he that desireth life, and loveth many days, that he may see good? 13 Keep thy tongue from evil, and thy lips from speaking guile. 14 Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it. 15 The eyes of the LORD are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry.
