## **What Fellowship Hath Righteousness with Unrighteousness?**

Many CHRISTIANS have a religious attitude that sees the people in the world as saved or unsaved. They have an us and them mentality that causes a separation between themselves and the world. "Religion" draws lines that qualify some people and separates other people.

They quote the scripture from **2 Corinthians 6:17** that says "come out from among them and be ye separate." It causes CHRISTIANS to

feel uncomfortable around "them," and the people of the world are just as uncomfortable being around Christians.

*Matthew 9:10* And it came to pass, as Jesus sat at meat in the house, behold, many publicans and sinners came and sat down with him and his disciples.

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Jesus was not like that! He did not have an "us and them" mentality. Sinners and publicans did not feel uncomfortable in his presence. Jesus drew "all men" unto him with love and compassion that was evident. Jesus could see the hearts of men and his one desire was to see them set free from the things that held them captive because he loved them.

*Matthew 11:28* Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. *29* Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. *30* For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

True ministry always produces a sense of freedom that does not leave people feeling threatened and uncomfortable.

*2 Corinthians 3:17 amp* Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty (emancipation from bondage, freedom).

I have to include myself in this category of Religious Christians.

I was taught to separate myself. After all, is that not what the Word says?

*2 Corinthians 6:14* Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?

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*15* And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel? *16* And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

This scripture is not talking about drawing a line of separation between us and the other people of the world. It is talking about drawing a line between ourselves and Satan's doctrine that judges people according to the law! Jesus came against the doctrine of the Pharisees. He did not come against sinners. He had mercy on them. There is no harmony between the value that Christ reveals in people and the worthlessness that Belial represents! Faith-righteousness and work based-righteousness are two opposites; they are conflicting systems that can never be yoked together. Jesus died for the sins of the whole world so that man could see that nothing stands between him and God. The only difference between us and "them" is that they just don't know that, and how will they unless we Minister to them with the same love and compassion that Jesus ministered to us with?

*Luke 4:18* The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,
