God, Where are You ?

breast cancer, a brother in law who was burned in a fire and had to spend 5 weeks in the hospital of which two weeks were in an ICU unit and a niece is dealing with a troubled pregnancy. In addition to all of this I was called upon to conduct the funeral service for a beautiful thirty year old young lady who was a member of the church I formerly co-pastored.

I finally had to put my trust and my faith in God and believe Him to be faithful to the same Word, that He has always been faithful to in my life.

My prayer for you is that when you come to that place in your life that you want to ask, "God, Where are You?" you will stop and let His Holy Spirit show you that He is as close to you as your next breath of air that you breathe. Amen & Amen!
