We have been working with her for about five years in the city of Cucuta, but she wanted to introduce us to some new pastors in other cities. In the eight days that we were with her, we did two pastors seminars, and preached in four towns and three cities. The schedule was full but it was exciting and new doors for future ministry were opened.

The last stop took us to Villavicencio, Colombia where we worked with Pastora Clemencia, our original Colombia contact! We were with her for a week and held a three day pastors conference and ministered in three churches. It is always exciting to be able to sow seeds into the hearts and lives of new pastors and brothers and sisters in Christ.

The enemy has been perverting the message of God's grace and love for centuries (Acts 13:10) and he is using the church to promote the perversion! Families are being destroyed and congregations are confused and divided because of this perversion. We have found that the best way to combat the perversion is to simply turn on the light! Unmerited favor-God is good but I don't deserve it. This common definition of grace almost killed me. I found myself continually trying to address that issue because more than anything I wanted to hear my savior say, Well done thou good and faithful servant. I spent years living under a sense of guilt because I knew that "Jesus paid my debt even though He did not owe anything and I owed him a debt that I could not pay!" I felt unworthy of the sacrifice that He made for me and in spite of all of my efforts to live up the expectations that I placed upon myself, nothing satisfied that sense of unworthiness.

One day I found myself reading the following scripture:

Luke 14:12 Then said he also to him that bade him, When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbours; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompence be made thee. 13 But when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind: 14 And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.

Jesus does not enjoy seeing us respond to his free gift with condemnation and guilt! I remember one year at Christmas time.
